The Origin of COSPLAY

While no one is really sure where cosplay comes from, there is evidence that cosplay is a combined fandom from both the USA and Japan. Before the word cosplay was coined, people were already dressing up as characters at comics and sci-fi conventions, as early as the 1930s in the USA.

Forrest J. Ackerman was an author and science fiction enthusiast is commonly acknowledged as the first person who wore a homemade costume—inspired by the movie Things To Come—at World Science Fiction Convention (World Con 1) in 1939. His costume was made by his then girlfriend Myrtle R. Jones, who also wore a costume herself. Their costumes were a hit at the convention and inspired others to also wear costumes of their own the following year.

Science fiction conventions became hugely popular and spread across the USA, and so did costumed visitors. Soon it inspired people to dress up at comic conventions as well. When the convention organizers realised how many people showed up in costumes, they started to arrange masquerade competitions, a tradition that still lives on today.

Cosplay History in SCANDINAVIA



DENMARK

Cosplay in Denmark is connected to the oldest Danish convention that actively invited cosplayers inside; J-Popcon. It was held for the first time in 2000 and had around 150 participants at the time, so saying that cosplay made its entry in Denmark in the early 2000, is probably not far from the truth.

When I first attended in 2005, it wasn't the norm for attendees of the convention to wear cosplays. At that time, you still kind of stood out if you did, but in a good way. In 2008 the convention SVS-con opened up with sleeping halls. This made it possible for people to dress up on site and not have to deal with traveling in cosplay to the convention. This made a big impact on the growth of the cosplay community.

Cosplay Branching out to other events

The growth and popularity of the cosplay events have not gone unnoticed by some of the older Danish events, where cosplay hadn't been a priority before. Events that had mainly focused on comics or games started actively trying to get cosplayers to attend somewhere around 2010- 2012.

In the last couple of years, we've seen more and more events try to cater to the cosplayers in some of the same ways. Events that focus on role playing, fantasy, Harry Potter, or something similar but where cosplay fits in very easily.

Cosplay in Mainstream Denmark

Up until around 2013 it was still kind of weird and embarrassing to tell people that you were a cosplayer, because you also had to explain to them what cosplay was. The very limited presentation on radio and television gave the impression that it was something teenagers did to escape reality.
